Announcing Field Day 2010: WeLCARS and the Stoned Moneys Do It Again!

Would you believe this is the 4th annual Field Day for WeLCARS and the Stoned Monkey clubs? Not bad for a group that wasn't supposed to last more than 6 months. OK, lets get to the dates: Field Day for 2010 takes place on June 26th and 27th.

After checking the wants of the club it was determined that we

will again run Field Day out of the WeLCARS World Wide Head Quarters (WWWHQ), otherwise known as the Fox Lake Community Center, at 23 South Street in Fox Lake of course. After discussing the two available locations we determined the WWWHQ would serve our needs better for several reasons. It's hard to say if the lack of bugs or indoor facilities won the vote. Also we found that the tremendous noise floor seems to have been corrected thanks to the folks at METRA.

This year we will be operating most likely as class 4A or 5A depending on the turn out. To capture the higher power multiplier we will be using power levels of 150 watts or less for all stations. I am hopeful that we can find someone to make a few CW QSOs, let us know. Better yet, if you know someone that could man the GOTA station and rack up 500 CW QSOs let us know quick. [Before another group snatches them up! - Ed.] Remember a GOTA operator is defined as a recently licensed/upgraded ham (since last F/D) or a "generally inactive" Ham, though they don't define inactive very well. If you fit the classification of having obtained your current license since last F/D and would like to operate the GOTA station please let us know.

At the current time we are gathering specifics on station equipment. The information at this time is the basic antenna list that generally is the first out.



Starting at the bottom:

80 Meters: We will be using the K9TMS shortened Dipole. Come see whether we are able to use the Spud Guns to get this up nice and high.

40 Meters: We will most likely be using the K9TMS rotatable dipole we used last November for

Sweeps. This antenna will be mounted on a Hula Tower with rotor.

20 Meters: We will have N9QDS's rotatable dipole as well as theon a Hula Tower.

15 Meters: Is a question at this time.

6 Meters: One K9TMS 5 element beam on a Hula Tower

2 Meters: "N91FG Rover antenna minus feathers" mounted to the K9TMS Trailer Tower. [New for dinner this year: shish kebab and hot squab on a stick. - Ed.]

K9TMS Trailer Tower - Now New and Improved

Over the years I have been on the quest of locating a really good antenna system for Roving as well as suitable for PSA events. Recently my poor utility trailer has seen several different configurations of mounting antennas to it and being dragged from Wisconsin to central Illinois. But the issue has always been height, or the lack of, until now.

Back last Christmas I had been watching a series of bids for a military crank-up mast on eBay. I managed to finally get one of these military surplus wonders. For those of you collecting numbers the mast is part of the AN/TLQ-17 RF Jamming equipment. Generally my reading has found that these were mounted on vehicles from trucks to trailers.

After getting it I found a minor issue – a small dent that didn't want to allow the final section to deploy completely. KC9NJZ and his wonderful selection of body working tools came to the rescue. With a few taps here and there Jay was able to get the

dent out enough to allow full deployment of the mast, which is 18 feet. In the down position the top is basically just under 6 feet. This allowed me room to mount a rotor above and still get it under the 12' 6" suggested height for your rover antennas heading down the road with out remodeling them on bridges. [The maximum legal height for vehicles is 13' 6", but that assumes you follow truck routes. 12' 6" gives you a comfortable margin. - Ed.]

After several sketches and considerations I finally arrived at a solution that kept the mounting simple, secure and not over engineered significantly. The photo to the right shows what it looks like.

In this photo the trailer tower is being used with a simple vertical antenna for the Udder Century Bike race that we provided communications for. Time to setup the antenna is fairly fast – roughly 10 minutes if you have things ready to go. During this outing the wind gusted to 20 MPH with out movement of the tower.

At the top of the tower is a Penninger Mast Clap and Military mast adapter that allows the use of 1.78" aluminum military mast sections to extend the height. My calculations are that I can add an additional 8 foot of mast for vertical use with out impacting the system.

The 2nd outing for the tower will be at the VHF contest which it will see duty as our 223 FM antenna support. It will also see use at F/D as our 2 meter antenna support.

It's taken a while but I think I finally have found a decent Rover/Portable antennas support system.

We will also be attempting contacts via WSJT on 6 and 2 meters in the very late night and early morning hours Saturday and Sunday. Jay KC9NJZ and Joe KC9LFP will be heading up these attempts.

If you need assistance with setting up your equipment, logging software, or information on operating please feel free to contact any of the Monkeys and we will try to assist you with your needs.
